Seagulls is proud to support the local community through the NSW ClubGrants Scheme. Below is a full list of clubs and non-profit organisations we supported in 2024.

CATEGORY ONE

SHAPING OUTCOMES - \$10,000

Shaping Outcomes community First Steps program provides Early Childhood Intervention support to children with disabilities and developmental delays, and advocates for inclusion in community, building networks and capacity of primary care givers.

MINIFIT - \$10,000

School holiday program teaching boys and girls about movement, exercise and the importance of living a healthy lifestyle through hydration, sleep and screen time.

LEARNING LINKS COUNTING FOR LIFE - \$5,695

Delivers a results-focused numeracy program to support children in years 3-5 at Centaur Public School.

COOLANGATTA MELANOMA MARCH - \$5,000

Coolangatta Melanoma March is part of the MIA's annual fundraising campaign to raise awareness and funds for vital Melanoma research.

MURWILLUMBAH KINSHIP FESTIVAL - \$2,000

The Kinship Festival is a community capacity building event led and directed by the local aboriginal community, alongside key community stakeholders.

OUR KIDS - \$7,000

The A&E Department at Tweed Valley Hospital required a Panda Neonatal Resuscitaire Unit, a vital piece of equipment for neonatal babies which includes a warmer, monitoring devices and inbuilt resuscitation system.

THE SECRET BURDEN - \$10,000

The Secret Burden's My Body Project provides up to 12 attendees with the necessary tools and strategies to promote positive wellbeing practices in their life.

YOUNGER HEROES - \$10,000

A family and resilience-oriented program to build the connectedness and rebuild bonds between family members. Particularly relevant for parents who may spend significant time away from their children.

SUPERTEE PROJECT - \$5,000

The aim of the Fair Fight Foundation is to alleviate the discomfort and distress children experience when battling life-threatening conditions. They do this through the creation of innovative products and services that aid them in their treatments, surgery and scans in hospital.

TWEED FAMILY OF LEAGUE - \$9,500

Funding helps the Family of League care financially, emotionally and socially for men, women and children of the Rugby League Community. In the last 12 months 264 people have been supported to a value of \$879,393 and 880 wellbeing visits have been made.

YOUTH MUSIC VENTURE - \$10,000

YMV is free program for young people 11-17 years old. They are formed into bands with mentoring and rehearsals, culminating in a rock concert. Kids learn life skills and team building along the way.

AGAPE KITCHEN UPGRADE - \$7,000

AGAPE SECURITY UPGRADE - \$7,000

AGAPE is a community-funded, volunteer-powered charity, delivering support to address food insecurity, mental health and well-being, trauma recover, social connection and so much more to the homeless in Tweed. The kitchen upgrade will go towards upgrading the kitchen to be more sustainable. The security upgrade will improve the security of the boundary fencing protecting the building from vandals. .

COMMUNITY INDIGENOUS CONNECTION PROGRAM \$4,500

To connect and engage Tweed Seagulls youth with the Indigenous Community through education of their local culture.

FRED'S PLACE (ST. VINCENT DE PAUL) - \$2,000

Fred's Place helps up to 120 clients daily, providing many with 3 meals and other services such as laundry, internet access, Centrelink assistance. Many clients are women, and indigenous members with complex needs including trauma, addictions and mental health issues.

CATEGORY TWO

SEAGULLS RUGBY LEAGUE FC - \$400,000

Supporting the growth of Rugby League in Tweed.

SEAGULLS JUNIOR RUGBY LEAGUE - \$62,000

Supporting the growth of Rugby League in Tweed.

TWEED DRAGONS INC - \$1,000

Support for national dragon boating championships.

SEAGULLS SPORTS COUNCIL - \$10,000

Providing opportunities for members to participate in various sports and hobby groups.

SEAGULLS NETBALL CLUB - \$5,000
